3. 10' to 12' Dwarf
4. Naturally Dwarfed (Montmorency 15', Contender 12' to 15', Veteran 10' to 12')

All Fruit Trees and Bushes that we are offering have been customized to the Garrett County area's climate and growing conditions! All cultivars are hardy zone 5, with most being zone 4 or below. Additionally, most of the varieties are on specialized rootstocks for enhanced cold-hardiness, increased trunk sturdiness, and drought tolerance.
